

Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy Screenings

Dear Parents,

As we prepare to embark on the 2024-2025 school year, we extend a heartfelt welcome to all students. As of September 30th, 2024, your child will be able to receive a complete speech/language and/or occupational therapy screening. These screenings are utilized to determine if a child is developing within the average range when compared to other children his or her age.

What is a Speech and Language Screening?

Approximately 10% of children struggle with communication disorders. Speech and language screenings are a wonderful tool to determine if a child is developing within the average range when compared to other children of his or her age. Children who receive speech/language therapy in their early years of life have a much higher rate of success than those who begin intervention later.

The following areas will be screened:

- Articulation (Pronunciation)
- Fluency (Stuttering)
- Receptive (Understanding Language)
- Expressive (Using words and/or forming sentences)
- Voice (Hoarseness)
- Auditory Processing
- Phonological Awareness

What is an Occupational Therapy Screening?

Occupational therapy addresses important areas of development such as fine motor skills, handwriting skills, visual perceptual skills and sensory processing. These skills provide a solid foundation for academic success. If your child is having difficulty with motor coordination, efficiency in performing assignments or attending/focusing during academic tasks, an occupational therapy screening will determine if there is a need for further evaluation.

The following areas will be screened:

- Fine Motor Skills
- Handwriting
- Sensory Integration
- Attention
- Eye-Hand Coordination
- Visual Perceptual Skills
