

Dear Academy Parents,

With the end of the school year quickly upon us, we know that you are making plans for your child's summer activities. While the summer months are a welcome opportunity for fun and relaxation, the break from school activities often causes students to experience a lag in learning when returning to school. This learning lag is often referred to as the "Summer Slide." The summer slide can result in students losing two to three months of academic proficiency. As explained to your children last week, we are sharing with you the ensuing information.
